



NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH WILTSHIRE

HMRC ALERT

What you need to know

- Action Fraud has experienced an increase in the reporting of malicious calls and voicemails purporting to be from Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC).
- Fraudsters are spoofing genuine HMRC telephone numbers. They state the victim is liable for prosecution. They suggest this can be avoided by arranging payment immediately by methods such as bank transfer or by purchasing iTunes gift cards.
- If the victim is hesitant or refuses to comply, a threat is made such as immediate arrest, sending bailiffs to the victim's address or, in some cases, deportation.
- In genuine cases, HMRC will make direct contact with you via post/letter. If HMRC contact you via telephone they will quote the reference number on the initial letter. HMRC will **NOT** demand immediate payment.

What you need to do

- Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information. Contact the company directly using trusted methods such as a known email address or phone number.
- Legitimate organisations wouldn't ask you to pay taxes, bills or fees using an iTunes gift card, or any other type of voucher. If you're contacted by anyone that asks you to do this, you're likely the target of a scam.
- Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision. Under no circumstances would a genuine bank or some other trusted organisation force you to make a financial transaction on the spot.
- Report Phishing attempts. If you receive a call, text or email of this nature and have not lost money, you can report this as phishing to Action Fraud.

FURTHER INFORMATION RE "OUR" AIRFIELD

The 'Masterplan' application 17/08271/OUT was first submitted to Wiltshire Council in August 2018. It was there for all to see and comment on at the presentation held in Hullavington Church last September which was attended by Dyson representatives and more than 100 people from the village. Since then, separate applications for various works included within the Masterplan have been submitted and approved - for example:

18/08308/FUL. Land adjacent to Hangars 85 & 86; Erection of building to provide staff cafeteria.

18/08273/FUL. Provision of a new access arrangements to site, comprising a re-aligned section of C1 road and new roundabouts at both the junction of the A429/C1 road and on the C1 road.

18/08721/OUT. Scroll down to see Landscape figure 9 showing a masterplan of the airfield showing what other things are proposed in the future.

19/02543/FUL. Is under consideration by the Planning Officers. This shows the construction of a new hangar, extension to the existing runway and the provision of runway lighting and fencing.

All the details for any of these applications can be found by clicking on the relevant links. Work on the long awaited roundabout at the A329/C1 Junction will be starting in the not too distant future. It will

certainly make exiting that junction much safer.

April - 'The Husband's Secret' by Liane Moriarty

Mother of three, Cecillia discovers an old envelope in the attic. Written in her husband's hand, it says: to be opened only in the event of my death. John-Paul isn't dead, but curiosity eventually gets the the better of her. Cecilia opens the envelope and reads the letter within. Time stops.

Some readers enjoyed the style of writing and found humour in the pages, others couldn't emphathise with the characters. "I found the beginning frustrating, it took too long for her to read the letter and also too long for the link between the three characters to become clear. I did enjoy the actual contents of the letter as I was not expecting that! "I wasn't very positive about Husband's Secret. I looked up online reviews and mostly, they are glowing! Very easy reading suitable for the beach.'

May - 'Origin' by Dan Brown

Harvard Professor Robert Langdon arrives at the Guggenheim Museum to attend the unveiling of an astonishing scientific breakthrough. But before the secret can be revealed, the meticulously orchestrated evening is blown apart. With his life under threat, Langdon is forced to flee, aided by the museum's director, Ambra Vidal. The book was enjoyed by most of the group, which was a surprise for some. Comments: Dan Brown's novels are predictable, and the writing style sometimes too rapid. "The settings, the Guggenheim Museum, Bilbao, Basque Country, Spain, and Barcelona were recognisable".

Favourite Recipes

Banana 'healthy' mini muffins

2 large or 3 small ripe bananas2 eggs, 45g fine porridge oats60ml milk (or milk alternative)



- 1 tbsp milled flaxseed, 1 tbsp coconut oil or butter2 tbsp desiccated coconut (or ground almonds/peanut butter)pinch of salt
- Preheat oven to 180c/160c fan
- Mash bananas in a large bowl
- Add the eggs, pinch of salt, milk & flaxseed, mix well
- Coat a 12 cup mini-muffin tin evenly with the oil or butter
- Sprinkle the coconut (or almonds) into the base of each cup
- Spoon the mixture into each
- Bake for 15-20 mins until golden brown

Yummy but not too sweet, a healthy treat. They freeze well, perfect for lunch boxes and picnics. I sometimes add some vanilla essence and grate a bit of 85% chocolate for flavour. The picture shows baking cups but they cook fine straight in the tin—enjoy! Sally Jeeves



Food for thought....

'Polyunsaturated oil—everyone knows it's good for you, right? Wrong! And we all know artery-clogging, cholesterol-forming saturated fat is bad for you, don't we? Wrong again!' 'Vegetable oil, which isn't made from vegetables at all, but manufactured from seeds, has systematically replaced saturated fats in our diets over the past 100 years, but our rates of obesity heart disease, diabetes and cancer are higher than ever.'



So says David Gillespie in his latest book. The interesting thing about the author is that he isn't a medical doctor or scientist but a corporate layer in the IT industry. In his quest to discover why he, like so many of his generation was fat, he deciphered the latest medical findings on diet and weight gain, and what he found was chilling. 'Vegetable' oil makes you exceedingly vulnerable to cancer. 'You are eating it because it is much cheaper to make food with oils that are chemically extracted from plant seeds than it is to raise and slaughter an animal or grow a coconut tree'. The reason he wrote the book is compelling: 'I am telling you this because if you knew this (and could prove it) and didn't tell me and my family, I'd be furious with you.'

By vegetable oil he specifically means seed oils i.e. Corn, rapeseed oil etc. Hydrogenated versions or 'trans fats' as they're known are even worse. Unlike crushing oil from fruits such as olives, in order to get oil from seeds it needs several processes: cleaning and grinding to produce 'meal', pressing where the meal is heated, solvent extraction where it's treated with chemical solvents, decolouring where it's mixed with an alkaline such as sodium hydroxide, degumming where it has steam and acid bubbled through it to remove phosphatides, bleaching to lighten the colour and finally, deodorising where steam is passed over the oil in a vacuum at 250°C. This causes the volatile taste and odour to distil from the oil. Quite a scary process.

So what should we eat? For high smoke point cooking he recommends: Ghee, refined coconut oil, extra light olive oil, lard and butter. For drizzling over a salad, stick to something like cold pressed, virgin olive oil.

There's way more in the book than I can precis in a short article and clearly it's one person's opinion; it does seem to be in line with recent nutritional advice but I'll leave it to you to decide—it's certainly made me think hard about the choices I make at the supermarket, definitely food for thought..... Ed




