





HISTORY SPOT

London Trip Extra!

Bill and Ruth Sandiford spent the morning searching-out the places where Sir (St) Thomas More spent his early childhood, including schooling. Thomas was born and raised in Milk Street in the 15th Century, just a short walk along Cheapside to the east of St Pauls Cathedral. His father (Sir John More) was a lawyer. Thomas himself became a top judge, served as a King's Counsellor, and then became Chancellor of England. Sadly, Henry VIII had Thomas' head chopped off for not agreeing to his divorce from Queen Catherine, and re -marriage to Anne Boleyn. Obviously very brutal times. But fascinating stuff... especially for kids, apparently.

Here's a fanciful view, looking westwards along Cheapside, towards the old St Pauls Cathedral in the background. The medieval tower of St Mary-le-Bow (famous for its bells) is on the left. The two monuments in the middle of the road no longer exist. The nearest, known as "The Standard", was a water collection point. The farthest was "Eleanor's Cross", the site of daily hangings, beheadings and burnings in Thomas More's time. He'd have walked past it on his daily stroll from his home in Milk Street (top right), to St Anthony's school (bottom right).

Chair of the Parish Council Update

We were pleased to support the provision of the Christmas tree again this year. Thanks to Cllr Cundick for donating the tree, Cllr Slater for working with Gurkhas from 9 Reg RLC led by Sgt Dipak Rai to erect the tree and Dudley Hewitt for making sure everything was ready on the day. Cllr Slater had fun and games taking the tree down in slightly wet weather I am led to believe.

In support of a Group of Volunteers taking the initiative to organise and run a Warm Space Afternoon (Fridays) at the village hall, the Parish Council were pleased to provide a donation to help make it a success. It is open to everyone, not just those in need of some warmth.


Some of you will have used the New Book Swap Shelving and Bench Seating in the Watts Lane Bus Shelter. These were required to satisfy the Insurance company and public safety obligations. Thanks to Cllr Martin (donated the bench steelwork) and to Cllr Slater for sourcing additional material and time for installation. The Parklands Bus Shelter will have a wooden bench seat installed later this year.

Following the Speed Indicator Device damage last year, the council are looking into options for a new solar powered device that will most likely be permanently sited at the Grittleton end of the village.

Since taking on responsibility for the Defibrillator in 2020, it has been withdrawn 3 times by the Ambulance Service. After each use, an out of service message is received from Community Heartbeat. It is duly inspected, if serviceable (pads not used, no damage and battery is serviceable) the device is recorded as serviceable on-line, and the monitoring system updated. It just goes to show that it provides essential lifesaving support beyond the reach of our community.

WALKS AROUND HULLAVINGTON – Jon Atkey

The village centre footpath network



'm taking the opportunity this month to highlight the wonderful network of paths in and around the village centre. I'd also like to highlight some of the excellent footpath improvements that have been made by Dyson's Estates

Team recently and to thank them for their hard work—it's made a huge difference! Overgrowth has been cleared, tumble-down stiles have been replaced by nice new gates and slippery old metal bridges have been replaced with solid new wooden structures. The result has been to make our paths much more accessible and safe

The map above shows just how extensive the local network is and the pictures below show some of the new footpath works. If you've not seen any of these works yet and you fancy a stroll, a good place to start is by Hullavington Garage: With an eye on the above map, go down Frog lane and take the path at the end. Turn left through the wooden kissing gate and follow the path through to Watery Lane before turning left over the new bridge back to the Village Green and The Street.

If you enjoy walking with others, why not join Hullavington Footpath Group? We are a group of local residents seeking to enjoy, preserve, improve and promote the footpaths and other public rights of way in and around Hullavington. Our activities range from footpath working groups to organised walk events. You can find us by calling me on 07530 252793.



As you may have heard, it is very likely that the community will be given the use of the paddock at the pub once the planning permission goes through. As soon as we have more information we will shout it loud and clear.

Broadband and Fibre Optic Upgrade.

 You may well remember that back in July last year, due to a second round of government procurement, we had to pause the CFP which would have seen us being upgraded this year.

- This procurement and our participation in it is not yet finalised, however with only weeks to go before it goes out to tender all our postcodes are still currently included (12 January).
- If this remains the same, it will be the second time we have been a part of the so called 'National Rollout Programme'. Hopefully this time we will receive a bid, but it is not guaranteed.
- To ensure Hullavington Exchange is upgraded in the next 2 3 years we have secured the guarantee from OpenReach that regardless of circumstances

"If either the whole or part of the community are not picked up within the procurement, OpenReach WILL pick up with the current scheme (CFP66238) that is placed on hold by re-costing the final submitted address list."

- Written confirmation was received 23rd December
- The HCG would like to thank BDUK, Wiltshire Council's Broadband Team, Nick Botterill and James Grey for all their help to achieve this outcome.

Biodiversity Update

The Gauze Brook is the delightful little stream that runs through our village. It is fed by multiple feeds across the fields and villagers who walk locally will know this stream very well. In the summer the levels drop and recently, the stream has been in full spate.


Last summer a number of us were trained up as part of the river invertebrate monitoring scheme.

By monthly measurement of these little beasts it is

possible to get a good feel for the health of the stream.

We are also looking for more riverfly testers - there will be more training available later this year.

The good news is that there is



The bad news is that it is far less than 20 years ago. Working with the various agencies and especially the Bristol Avon River Trust, we are aiming to initiate several projects to turn this sad situation around. It has been twenty years since water voles were spotted on our river. If you are interested in any aspect of this as a villager or a landowner, please reach out to me.

HULLAVINGTON BOOK GROUP



We meet on the afternoon of the second Tuesday in the month in the side room at the village hall, when we enjoy refreshments and lively discussion about a wide range of books.

In November, we read 'Treacle Walker' by Alan Garner.

Joe Coppock squints at the world with his lazy eye. He reads comics, collects birds' eggs and treasures his marbles, particularly his prized dobbers. When Treacle Walker, a wanderer, a healer, appears off the moor one day, an unlikely friendship is forged and the young boy is introduced to a world he could never have imagined. Set in his beloved Cheshire, Alan Garner delivers a stunning fusion of myth and folklore and an exploration of the fluidity of time.

This book split the group, some loved it, others gave up just a few pages in. However, it appears that after a couple of reads - it is a short book - the magic of the story becomes clearer. This choice certainly provided us with great discussion. Myths, magic and local dialect, all come into the story. Some of us have caught some interviews with Alan Garner on the internet, and these have given an excellent insight into the thoughts which lie behind the book. Those of us who were not initially charmed by the story are going to read it again.

Reviews:

'Treacle Walker was such an interesting book as it left a lot to the imagination and provoked a lively discussion.'

'Although, when I was younger, I loved other Alan Garner books ('The Weirdstone of Brisingamen' and 'Moon of Gomrath') I found this book very hard to get into. After hearing other people's views I am going to give it another go and see if I can see more into the story - there seems to be a very deep meaning hidden there that I have missed.'

December: 'The Glasshouse' by Eve Chase

Outside a remote manor house in an idyllic wood, a baby girl is found. The Harrington family takes her in and disbelief quickly turns to joy. They're grieving a terrible tragedy of their own and the beautiful baby fills them with hope. They keep her secret, but something happens to end their blissful summer.

'The Glasshouse' was enjoyed by most, it was an east read. The descriptions of the forest and some of the characters were beautifully written.

Reviews:

'This is a story told principally through two characters, Rita and Sylvie. The Forest of Dean is a moody and magnificent backdrop to much of the novel which features lost and found babies. It jumps between two timelines so not as confusing as some novels that use this device to excess. The characters are either very likeable, despicable or a bit silly. I liked this novel and found it easy to read, great for the Christmas period. I loved the connection to the forest, somewhere we regularly camp. The final coincidence was one too many for me but I still enjoyed the story.'

'A well written, but slow burning mystery novel that is atmospheric with several twists and turns. The characters are interesting if somewhat dysfunctional and the novel effectively explores grief and the lengths one will go to for the one's we love. Overall and interesting if predictable novel that took me a while to get into'.

Then and Now

ong standing villager David Hunt has thoughtfully taken lots of photos of well know Hullavington landmarks over the years so we are now lucky enough to benefit from some brilliant comparisons!

This edtions feature is....

The Queen's Head

The then photo was taken in 1999 and shows the Queen's Head public house, which at that time was owned and being run by Ben and Heather Hicks. They had taken it over in 1991,



and finally closed it in 2007. This followed a long attempt to get planning permission to provide a restaurant area, which, though successful in the end, proved too costly to go ahead with. It is now private accommodation. The building on the left of the photo housed the skittle alley and could also be used as a function room complete with bar. This was used when my wife arranged a surprise and very enjoyable 50th birthday party for me with family and friends. One couple that came from a distance stayed for a night in the bed and breakfast that was available in the pub at that time. The building to the right of the Queen's was a barn, part of Mays Farm.

As can be seen in the now photo the skittle building has been converted into a dwelling, as has the barn to the right. One small sign that it once was a pub is the small plaque on the wall just to the right of the front door that says 'West Country Ales, 1760, Best in the West'.
